#### **ABOUT THE COVER**

The land, on which the village of Greencastle would be settled, was part of a land grant "first owned by Samuel Smith," who received a warrant in 1750 from the Penn proprietors. Thirteen years later, in 1763, William Allison, Sr. purchased the land from John Davidson. "No one knows when the tavern was built, but it did exist" when William purchased the land in 1763. In 1769, William "transferred 300 acres" to his son Col. John Allison, founder of Greencastle in 1782 – 240 years ago. It was here that John Allison brought his bride Elizabeth Wilkin and it is where they raised 12 children.

Many of today's major highways are attributable to migrating buffalo and Native Americans who hunted buffalo. When the white men arrived, they used the trails for exploring, trading, and settling. Along those trails, taverns were built by very early settlers to accommodate newcomers traveling the pack trails. The taverns were a respite – a place for the travelers to eat, sleep, and board their horses before getting back on the trail.

Today, we know the intersection of the two 1700's pack trails as Greencastle's Center Square.

At that I700's intersection was a tavern on the southwest corner, which became known as Allison's Tavern. The roads are U.S. Route II, that runs the length of the Cumberland Valley from the Susquehanna River to the Potomac River. It was the road to Carlisle and is so named today within the borough. The east/west pack trail was known then as the Baltimore Road, now PA Route I6, and Baltimore Street within the borough.

Through the succeeding centuries, there was always a hostelry on the lot of Allison's Tavern until 1923 when the National Hotel closed, due to the effects of Prohibition, which began in 1920. The old National Hotel building is now used for apartments and business establishments.

Brown's Mill School was built in 1836, two years after the Pennsylvania Legislature passed the Free School Act. In 1921 the school closed and stood empty, deteriorating until 1934 when a Memorial Association was formed to restore the building. The Brown's Mill School was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1973.

In 2002, the non-profit Franklin County Historical Society purchased the Brown's Mill School from the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission through the generosity of Thomas G. and Nancy H. In 2002, the non-profit Franklin County Historical Society purchased the Brown's Mill School from the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission through the generosity of Thomas G. and Nancy H.
