NOTEWORTHY ACTIVITIES:

Arrested two persons on outstanding warrants at the Green Motel. Additionally one was found to be in possession of Drug Paraphernalia and was charged with that as well.

The first of the month saw the install of new Bodycams and the training of our Officers.

Attended the Ribbon Cutting for the new facility for Over the Rainbow Child Center. The new facility will allow them to better serve our community.



We continued to receive complaints about the alleged fraudulent business practices of a local company. As of today a total of 77 counts of Theft have been filed. Det Russell has done an outstanding job of putting this case together. The dollar loss is app. \$175,000

While responding to a reported domestic an Officer observed a vehicle matching the suspect's vehicle leaving town. He stopped the vehicle and located the suspect while another Officer checked the victim. Upon finding an assault had taken place the offender was arrested and taken to jail.

Turned over 74 lbs. of prescription medicines to the PA National Guard for destruction.

Lone Officer responded ahead of PSP to "Shots Fired" just west of town and found that a home had been struck by gunfire. The investigation is continuing by PSP.

The Department spent time in the follow-up investigation of two registered sex offenders who reside in town and may not be in compliance with state law.



Officers Creager and Bradley did a great job of explaining the Criminal Justice system to the 3 graders of GASD. This annual event is held with the assistance of Justice Cunningham at his office. As in many years past the role of the “bad guy” was filled by Justice Eyer of Mercersburg. A big thank you to all who make this possible.



Our Co-Responder has been busy assisting several local residents in trying to get their lives back in order. Some just needed assistance in working through the processes required in order to get medical care, financial assistance or secure housing.

Mrs. Faight and Off Knechtel completed required training to manage our reporting system.

Several Officers were recognized by the Mayor for incidents handled recently. Thank-you Mayor for taking the time to recognize good work and thank-you Councilman Regan for your attendance.



The Dept. recently hosted “Coffee with a Cop” at the Jerome King Playground. Had a great time meeting with local community members and explaining some of the functions of the Police Dept.



During the month of May all 4 Police Cruisers received the PA State Inspection.

Officers had a heavy Police presence at Jerome King Playground during the recent GASD 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Field Day.

GPD hosted a GAHS Junior for a ½ day in a Job Shadow event where we answered numerous questions about a potential career in law enforcement.

6 Officers completed updated CPR and First Aid classes as part of their Act 120 certification. Thank-you to the Rescue Hose Company for use of your facility and making this possible.



On May 29<sup>th</sup> GPD and the Rescue Hose Company Fire Police as well as assisting Fire Police agencies coordinated the traffic for the Memorial Day Parade.

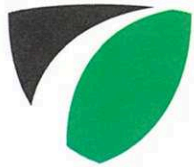
