Regular Meeting, June 3, 1935, Council Hall, 8:00 P. M.

The regular June meeting of Council was held on the above date. The following were present: Councilmen; Stover, Davison, Friedley, Hoachlander, Gilland, Seibert, and Burgess, Shinham.

Due to the absence of President Walck, Mr. Hoachlander was nominated and elected President Pro. Tem.

Minutes of the last regular meeting were read and approved.

Police Chief, Ambrose reported 15 arrests for May.

On motion, tha above reports were approved and accepted.

The following charges for use of borough equipment and of labor furnished by borough was agreed upon: -

Burgess Shinham reported that several concerns operating in the Borough had refused to pay the license for canvassing as provided by ordinance. On motion, he was instructed to enforce this ordinance and show no discrimination to any persons.

Bills totaling \$ 360.29 were ordered paid. (See ledger)

On motion Dr. Seibert, seconded by Mr. Stover, the Light Committee was authorized to secure affidavits and other information concerning alleged discrimination and irregularaties practiced by the Greencastle L. H. F. & P. Co. and if facts warrant to take action before the Public Service Commission.

On motion Mr. Stover, seconded by Mr. Friedley, the 1935 taxes were fixed the same as in 1934, namely, Boro tax, 1 1/2 mills; Bond tax, 4 mills.

Pres. Hoachlander appointed Dr. Gilland and Mr. Stover as a committee to investigate unnecessary and unsightly poles on the streets and to have same removed.

Mr. Hoachlander, of the Street Committee presented a program for street work which called for repairs and oiling to the following:-

Madison Street from Linden to Jefferson Sts. Grant Street from canning factory to Linden Ave., Linden Ave. from Grant to Allison Street.

Raymond Monn Alley, Spring Grove Avenue.

Carl Avenue from Baltimore to Franklin Sts.,

Several Alleys on west side of town.

Several other small projects.

On motion, Dr. Seibert, the street committee was authorized to proceed with this work and to purchase necessary oil and supplies.

On motion Mr. Davison, seconded by Dr. Gilland, the Water Committee was authorized to proceed with the work of building a retaining wall at Moss Spring as soon a possession of the land is given the borough.

Burgess Shinham reported much speeding. On motion, the burgess was authorized to take necessary steps to curb speeding; to hire a car for use of the police; or take other necessary action.

Meeting of June 3, 1935 continued.

The matter of installing a 4 light traffic signal at the intersection of Baltimore and Washington Streets as requested by the local Rotary Club and private citizens who appeared before the opening of the meeting, was discussed at length. Cost of such installation was estimated at about \$ 464.80; and the annual cost of operation at about \$ 292.74.

On motion of Mr. Stover, seconded by Dr. Gilland, action on the above was tabled, and the following plan ordered put in operation as promptly as possible:-

Parking to be prohibited for a distance of 60 feet from this intersection on the East, West and South.

Center lines to be painted on the streets to the East, West and South.

"Slow" to be painted upon the streets to the East and West, and "Slow" and "Stop" to be painted on the street to the south.

Curbs to be painted in yellow paint and marked "no parking" in the no parking area mentioned above.

That 12 metal "no parking" signs be purchased and placed so as to protect the restricted parking area.

On motion, adjourned.
