POLICE OPERATIONS / OIC, STRATEGIC PLANNING: I have regular briefings with OIC Keith Russell. Our law enforcement service continues to be challenged by limited staffing requiring officers to often work alone responding to calls from citizens and visitors for police assistance. OIC Russell has been very proactive in advancing the Department to benefit Greencastle while providing public safety to our citizens and visitors. As I am on station a steady stream of citizens from the region bring in unused drugs for proper disposition and visit for police services both in and out of the Borough with referrals to the proper agency.
