REGIONAL CRIME ACTIVITIES: SPECIAL TRAINING AT RESCUE HOSE COMPANY: As criminal activities have no municipal boundaries our public safety providers are involved with activities that may not begin here, however, come to Greencastle. One example is recovery of a stolen vehicle located near S. Washington Street from Hagerstown. RESPONSIBLE FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE POLICE BUDGET): I recommend Council discuss and modify item c. for the purchase of a replacement police vehicle in the event an LSA grant is approved. By further deferring one or two replacements, with supply chain vehicle issues, new police vehicles may be further deferred until 2025 that may drive the costs even higher and further depreciate the current vehicles for replacement. Also, reference item f. the Borough Manager would seek advice from the Mayor with his nearly 40 years of public safety budget experience. Please consider adding the Mayor to assist the Borough Manager for police budget management if the new Chief needs assistance.
