
We have been able to provide 24/7 coverage throughout the month of April despite having one full-time officer out on sick leave and the other staff shortages.


The License Plate Reader has continued to have hardware issues but has been repaired and is functioning as desired. I will compile detailed reports stating the efficacy of its implementation as statistics begin to emerge.



Our new \$5k radar sign was deployed, compiling data, and was involved in a traffic accident. A one car vehicle accident struck the signpost where it was deployed, causing severe damage to the electronic sign. The operator of the vehicle was having a medical emergency and was transported to the hospital for treatment. We wish her a full recovery. Contact was made with the operator's insurance company and payment for a replacement sign has been released. We received the new replacement sign on May 3, 2024. I anticipate that sign being redeployed by Tuesday, May 7, 2024, to complete the required supplemental information needed for the traffic study related to the safety of E Baltimore St and Ridge Ave. crosswalk.

As the weather continues to improve, the Greencastle Police Dept. continues to see an uptick of issues at the Jerome King Playground. One incident is where a group of juveniles began arguing with each other, the one group left the area, only to return and continue to engage in verbal arguments and it eventually evolved into a physical fight. During the investigation, a video that one of the other juveniles made of the incident, one of the juveniles brandished. A black handgun the fighting stopped, and juveniles fled.

Through an investigation, the suspect who brandished the handgun was identified, interviewed and the handgun was recovered. The handgun proved to be a licensed Glock replica BB gun that he had just received that afternoon from an Amazon order. Pending completing the interviews with the remaining juveniles, changes of Felony Aggravated Assault, Harassment, Disorderly Conduct, and other charges are anticipated.
