

MAYOR'S AND POLICE REPORTS TO THE COUNCIL AND CITIZENS OF GREENCASTLE October 7, 2024

NATIONAL FIRE PREVENTION WEEK: The National Fire Protection Association® (NFPA®) announced "Smoke alarms: make them work for you![™]" as the official theme for <u>Fire Prevention Week[™]</u>, October 6–12. This year's focus on working smoke alarms comes in response to NFPA data, which shows that the majority of U.S. home fire deaths continue to occur in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.

Saturday's Fire Prevention Week open house was held at the Rescue Hose Company with hundreds of citizens attending the annual program. I personally spoke with several citizens that attended the open house for the very first time and were amazed at the equipment, operation, and history (museum).
