## **February Updates**



GPD conducted its mandatory annual Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training Commission (MPOETC) in-service training, as required for certification and compliance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. This year's training session took place on February 17th and 18th, with the training room graciously provided by the Greencastle Rescue Hose Company.

#### Training Overview:

This year's in-service (MIST) training programs covered a variety of essential topics:

#### 1. Legal Updates:

Officers were briefed on recent changes in laws that affect law enforcement procedures, ensuring that GPD remains in full compliance with state and federal regulations.

#### 2. Homelessness Awareness:

This segment provided training on how to interact with and assist homeless individuals in a compassionate and legally compliant manner while also addressing issues such as mental health and substance abuse.

#### 3. Tactical Response:

A critical focus of this module was enhancing officers' tactical skills in high-stress situations. Training involved situation awareness to improve decision-making when responding to critical incidents.

#### 4. Elder Abuse:

Officers were educated on recognizing and responding to signs of elder abuse, an increasingly important area of concern for both law enforcement and the community.

#### Conclusion:

The successful completion of the mandatory MIST training ensures that all GPD officers are up to date with legal requirements and prepared to effectively handle the challenges they face in their duties. The department remains committed to ongoing professional development to serve the residents of Greencastle with the highest level of expertise and dedication.
