



Community Involvement

On May 1st, 2025, Mayor Thomas – Ericka – and I had the privilege of attending the National Day of Prayer service hosted by Greencastle Presbyterian Church. May 11th – 17th, 2025, marked Police Week, a time to honor and remember the dedicated men and women of law enforcement who have lost their lives in the line of duty. In 1962, President John F. Kennedy proclaimed May 15th as National Peace Officers Memorial Day, with the calendar week in which May 15th falls officially designated as National Police Week. This declaration, made through a joint resolution of Congress, acknowledges the invaluable contributions and sacrifices made by law enforcement officers across the nation.

National Police Week serves as an important occasion for communities to come together in support of fallen officers, their families, and colleagues. During this week, various ceremonies, memorial services, and events take place, including the National Peace Officers Memorial Service, held at the U.S. Capitol, where the names of fallen officers are engraved on the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial. These observances offer a time for reflection, remembrance, and a reaffirmation of the commitment to the safety and protection of others that law enforcement officers uphold daily.

National Police Week is also a time to express appreciation for the bravery, dedication, and selflessness of the law enforcement community, while recognizing the sacrifices made by officers and their families in service to the public.

Between 2020 - 2024 there have been 1438 Officers killed in the line of duty.



On May 19th, Officer Creager, Officer Ketchel, and I had the privilege of presenting an educational field trip for the third-grade students of Greencastle-Antrim School District. This event provided a valuable learning opportunity, allowing the students to gain insight into the role of law enforcement in addressing individuals who make poor choices and find themselves arrested.

As part of the experience, the students witnessed a "mock" arrest, followed by an arraignment before Magistrate Cunningham. The field trip was both educational and engaging, providing the students with a deeper understanding of the justice system in a real-world context.



Training

On May 20th, Ericka, Officer Kamoie, and I participated in a free training session offered by Norfolk Southern. The training focused on emergency operations in the event of a large-scale train emergency. It was highly informative and provided valuable insights for emergency responders, enhancing our understanding of how to effectively manage such situations.
