June Updates

Community Involvement

Jerome King Playground Cameras Assist in Criminal Investigations

The surveillance cameras installed at Jerome King Playground in June have already proven to be a valuable tool in enhancing public safety. Since their installation, the cameras have assisted in two separate cases of criminal activity.

In one case, footage from the cameras played a key role in the investigation of a stolen vehicle, helping authorities identify and track the suspect. In a separate incident, the cameras captured acts of vandalism to the public restrooms, providing critical evidence that is now being used to pursue charges.

Firearm Recovered; One Arrested

On June 10, 2025, Officer Kamoié was dispatched to 318 Town Drive for the recovery of an unknown firearm discovered inside the residence. Upon arrival, a 9mm pistol containing 27 live rounds of ammunition was found unsecured and loaded on a bed in a bedroom belonging to Nathan Shuck, an 18-year-old male resident.

Also residing in the home were two adults and a three-year-old child, creating a significant safety concern due to the accessibility of the loaded weapon.

A check of the firearm's serial number confirmed that it had been reported stolen out of North Carolina.

Following an investigation, Shuck was arrested and charged with Receiving Stolen Property (F2) and Recklessly Endangering Another Person (M2). He is subsequently lodged in the Franklin County Jail.

Training

GPD annual firearms qualification training continues. Two additional officers have joined the Hagerstown Community College Police Department to participate in a training session at the Hagerstown Police Department firearms range. This training remains highly valuable for our officers, who not only complete the qualification process but also participate in scenario-based training that focuses on dynamic movements and shooting techniques. The training covered essential drills, such as transitioning between lethal and less-lethal platforms, enhancing our officers' versatility and readiness. Future dates for the other Officers will be upcoming.

Code Enforcement

Demolition Progress at 43 West Madison Street

The demolition project at 43 West Madison Street is moving forward as planned. The outbuilding on the property has been successfully removed, and work has now begun on the demolition of the main house.

Once completed, the property will be cleared entirely, resulting in a fully vacant lot. We appreciate the community's patience and cooperation as this project continues.



Borough Begins Remediation of Outstanding Grass and Weed Violations

As authorized by Borough Council during the June meeting, the Borough has officially begun the remediation of properties with outstanding grass and weed violations. This action follows notifications of non-compliance to property owners in violation of the Borough's property maintenance codes.

The remediation efforts include mowing and clearing overgrown vegetation on affected properties to maintain public safety, appearance, and community standards. Property owners will be billed accordingly for services rendered, as outlined in the Borough's enforcement procedures.

The Borough appreciates residents' cooperation as we continue working to maintain a clean and well-kept community.
