

Training

On September 18th, Officer Morrow traveled to Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP) to attend the GLOCK Armorer's School. This valuable training ensures that our department maintains the capability to properly service and maintain our issued GLOCK pistols in-house. By having a certified armorer on staff, we are able to extend the life of our equipment, reduce downtime for repairs, and maintain the highest standards of safety and readiness for our officers.



Officers Morrow, Knopp, Knechtel, and Police Administrator Ericka Faight attended Emergency Vehicle Operator Course (EVOC) training hosted by the Hagerstown City Police Department in partnership with the Washington County Sheriff's Office. The training was conducted at the Hagerstown Regional Airport and provided participants with advanced instruction in vehicle handling and operational safety.

During the training, participants utilized the skills cone course to improve maneuvering techniques and reinforce safe driving practices under controlled conditions. This training not only enhanced their driving proficiency but also helped each officer gain a better understanding of personal and vehicle limits while operating in emergency scenarios.

Escort
