

Regular Meeting, March 6, 1933.
Council Hall, 7:30 P. M.

The regular March meeting of Council was held in Council Hall on the above date with the following present:-

Burgess D. W. Shinham, Pres. W. Earl Gardner and councilmen Stover, Hoachlander, Miller, Bryson, Leshner and Frank. President Gardner presiding.

Minutes of the last regular meeting and one special meeting were read by the secretary and were approved without correction.

Messers Marvin Gonso and Chas. Holbert appeared before Council in behalf of the Rescue Hose Company and explained the desirability of installing a fire siren with remote control to be operated from the telephone exchange or elsewhere. President Gardner directed that the Fire and Water committee of council confer with members of the fire company and secure estimates on the probable cost of such an installation.

Mr. Roy Stover turned in a petition signed by a number of residents complaining of the nuisance caused by dogs running at large, and asking that borough ordinance or state law on this subject be enforced. The petition was ordered turned over to the Burgess with the recommendation that he take necessary steps to abate this nuisance.

Pres. Gardner presented a new ordinance on the regulation of gasoline pumps and hose racks which had been prepared by attorney Hoke. Following reading of the ordinance by the secretary, the ordinance was ordered passed and ordered published according to law. (For text of ordinance, see ordinance book)

On motion of Mr. Miller, seconded by Mr. Stover the treasurer was exonerated from collecting all past due license fees on existing

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gasoline pumps and hose racks as provided by ordinance.

Mr. E. P. Wine and Arthur Strickler spoke to Council in the interests of the Greencastle Realty Co. and requested that in the event that S. Allison St. was extended that it be extended thru to Maple Avenue. Pres. Gardner promised consideration of this matter.

Burgess Shinham called attention to the fact that "speed limit" signs had not yet been erected, and the Public Property Committee was instructed to see that such signs were erected as soon as possible.

The matter of rebuilding the borough right-of-way leading to the Carbaugh Spring was next discussed. The Water Committee recommended that this work be undertaken at once in order to take advantage of labor under the Talbot Act. On motion of Mr. Hoacklander Water Committee was authorized to proceed with the building of the above named road. Councilman Bryson cast the only dissenting vote.
