

Regular Meeting, Council Hall,
November 6, 1933, 7:30 P. M.

The regular November meeting of Council was held on the above date with President Gardner presiding and the following members present:-

President W. Earl Gardner, and Councilmen Hoachlander, Stover, Miller, Leshner and Frank.

Minutes of the last regular meeting were read by the secretary and were declared approved without corrections.

Borough Treasurer, Chas. W. Bert, Jr. reported as follows:-

Balance in Borough Account, - - - - -	\$ 4021.21
Balance in Bond Account, - - - - -	\$ 3455.00

The secretary reported receipts for the month totaling \$ 2201.36, of which amount \$ 1260.00 represented borough tax collections; \$ 882.59, water rent collections; and the balance from the sale of oil, chips and other items. In addition to the above the sum of \$ 2340.00 was turned in to the Bond treasury from tax collections.

On motion, both the treasurer's and secretary's reports were approved and accepted.

Police Chief Ambrose reported 10 arrests during the month which resulted in the collection of \$ 44.00 in fines.

On motion, the sum of \$ 100.00 was ordered transferred from the Bond to the Borough account to repay a loan made at a previous date.

Mr. A. G. Dale appeared before Council and presented a petition bearing the signatures of 16 citizens requesting that some action be taken toward providing a better sidewalk along the Kuhn property on W. Franklin St. between S. Carlisle St. and Elm Lane. After some discussion, the matter was referred to the street committee for investigation.

Councilman Miller reported that he had had a request from Mr. Sam'l. Hicks for the installation of a street light near his residence on East Madison Street. No action was taken.

No action was taken on the payment of a bill from Mr. S. W. Yingling for compensation insurance for borough employees and the fire company, pending an investigation of the entire matter of this type of insurance.

Water Manager, Bert, read a letter from the State Highway Dep't. asking that suitable markers be placed at all points where the borough water main crosses state or state aid highways. On motion he was instructed to put such markers in place.

Meeting of Nov. 6, 1933 continued.

New piping for the chlorine tanks at the weir house and a thorough cleaning of the same was also authorized.

A request from Mr. McCleary of the McCleary oil company for permission to furnish water thru his meter to Mr. Harry Miller was refused. Water records indicated that the water had been cut off of Mr. Miller for non-payment of rent, and on motion it was decided that all back rents must be paid before water service could be re-established. Complaint was also made that the premises of the above mentioned Harry Miller were in a very unsanitary condition and the secretary was instructed to have the Chief of Police or Health Officer investigate and take the necessary steps to abate this nuisance.

Purchase by the water-department of 1/2 doz goose-neck service couplings and proper fittings was authorized.

President Gardner reported receipt of a letter from Attorney Hoke stating that the G. M. Johnson water suit would be held at the December term of court unless there should be some unforeseen development in the meanwhile.

It was pointed out by the Street Committee that the short piece of sidewalk on Washington St. in front of the Council Hall property was in bad condition and in need of repair. On motion, this committee was authorized to rebuild this portion with concrete, and also to install concrete curbs and water tables on the North side of the property if found to be advisable.
