Organization Meeting, Council Hall,  
January 8, 1934, 8:00 P. M.

Greencastle Borough Council met for the purpose of organization and for any other business on the above date at 8:00 P. M.

Present: Burgess D. W. Shinham and Messers Roy W. Stover, E. G. Hoachlander, W. Earl Gardner, Dr. T. H. Gilland, Dr. W. E. Seibert, L. R. Walck and Robert T. Davison.

The newly elected members, viz, Dr. Gilland, Dr. Seibert, Mr. Walck and Mr. Davison were sworn in by Burgess Shinham who then called the meeting to order, and called for nominations for President of council.

W. Earl Gardner and L. R. Walck were placed in nomination. Mr. Walck asked that his name be withdrawn. There being only one candidate a vote by acclamation was taken with the result that Mr. W. Earl Gardner was declared elected. Mr. R. T. Davison cast a dissenting vote and asked that the same be recorded.

President Gardner then took the chair and called for nominations for Borough Secretary. The name of John J. Carl was placed in nomination and upon a vote was unanimously elected.

Upon calling for nominations for Borough treasurer, the name of Charles W. Bert, Jr. was presented, who was also declared unanimously elected after a vote was taken.

The following applications for Chief of Police were read by the secretary:- O. C. Ambrose, Fred. Grosh and G. W. Stumbaugh. A vote by ballot was ordered and the secretary and President designated as tellers. Upon counting the votes it was found that Mr. O. C. Ambrose had received a majority of the votes and was declared elected.

Applications for the position of Water Manager were received from Charles W. Bert, Jr. and from C. S. Phipps. A vote by ballot was ordered with tellers acting as above. A count of votes cast gave Mr. Bert a majority and his election was declared.

Mr. D. L. Myers was elected by unanimous vote for the position of janitor at Council hall; and Mr. Charles F. Homer was likewise chosen for clock-winder and electrician.

Mr. Minnich, an attorney from Waynesboro addressed Council in behalf of Mr. Charles Crider. He explained that he was familiar with a borough ordinance prohibiting the erection of

gasoline pumps and hose racks within certain restricted zones, but asked that in view of certain expenses that Mr. Crider had incurred before the passage of this ordinance in anticipation of putting in a pump, that some arrangement be made whereby he could install such a pump. Pres. Gardner promised due consideration would be given this request.

The secretary John J. Carl, reported receipts as follows:-

On account of the illness of Treasurer Chas. W. Bert, no report was available.

At this point minutes of the last regular meeting were read by the secretary and approved without correction.

A detailed report from Chief of Police Ambrose listing his arrests for the term ending Jan. 1, 1934, was read. It indicated 116 arrests had been made and a total of \$ 390.00 fines collected.

A number of visitors made complaint that a number of registered unemployed could not obtain work under the CWA, while in some cases two or more from one family were on the pay-roll. Council was asked to take some action, if possible to insure that this work be more equitably distributed. President Gardner requested that Burgess Shinham record the names and addresses of all local citizens still unemployed, and appointed a committee comprising the Burgess and councilmen Gilland and Seibert to submit said list to the CWA headquarters and make an effort to secure a larger allotment of work so as to enable more men to be put to work.

Burgess Shinham stated that in several cases the fee for the examination of intoxicated drivers had been cut from \$ 5.00 to \$ 3.00, and that local physicians were not willing to make examinations for this amount. A letter on this subject written to attorney Hoke was not answered. The secretary was instructed to write Mr. Hoke and request an immediate reply.

President Gardner announced the appointment of various committees for the year as follows:-

Street. L. R. Walck, Chairman; Dr. Seibert; Mr. Hoachlander.

Fire & Water. Dr. Seibert, Chairman; Mr. Stover; Mr. Gardner.

Light. Dr. Gilland, Chairman; Mr. Gardner; Mr. Walck.

Ordinance. Mr. Hoachlander, Chairman; Dr. Gilland; Mr. Walck.

Public Property. Mr. Davison, Chairman; Mr. Hoachlander; Dr. Gilland.

Finance. Mr. Stover, Chairman; Mr. Hoachlander; Dr. T. J. Davison,
