

Special Meeting, Council Hall,
June 17, 1935, 8:30 P. M.

A special meeting called by the President was held in Council Hall on the above date with the following present:-

Burgess, D. W. Shinham, President L. R. Walck, and councilmen Davison, Stover, Hoachlander and Friedly.

President stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of considering an agreement with the Pennsylvania Railroad company providing for the removal of their track from Carlisle Street, and for the consideration of an ordinance authorizing the execution of the same.

The above mentioned agreement was presented to Council by Mr. Hoachlander. (Full text is recorded on page 94 of ordinance book.)

An ordinance authorizing execution of the above ordinance was read by the Secretaty, and upon motion of Mr. Stover, seconded by Mr. Hoachlander, was unanimously passed.


The secretary reported receipt of a check from attorney John W. Hoke for \$ 544.25 representing payment of the \$ 500.00 judgement against Geo. M. Johnson plus interest from Dec. 12, 1933 to Jun. 3, 1935.

A bill for \$ 250.00 from Edmund C. Wingerd and John W. Hoke was also presented. Bill stated that this amount was for "Services in preparing briefs and arguing motions of the plaintiff for a new trial, and for judgement n.o.v. and securing payment in the case of George M. Johnson vs. the Borough of Greencastle".

Considerable discussion followed the presentation of this bill. Mr. Stover and Mr. Hoachlander, both members of the legal committee at the time of the Johnson suit, stated positively that at the time of the payment of \$ 650.00 to Mr. Hoke in Dec. 1933, that the attorneys for the Borough stated and agreed that the sum of \$ 650.00 then paid would include any further legal services connected with this case as long as the case was in the local courts. In view of the above, no action was taken toward payment of the bill, and the secretary was instructed to write Mr. Hoke, state the above facts, and ask for an explanation.

The matter of enforcing the hawking and pellers ordinance was discussed. It was the consensus of opinion of Council that this ordinance should be strictly enforced.
