The regular July meeting of Council was held on the above date with the following present:-

Chief of Police, Ambrose reported 16 arrests during June.

On motion, all of the above reports were approved.

The secretary read a letter from the County Treasurer calling attention to a recent law permitting delinquent taxpayers to pay 20% of back taxes each year for five years and thus avoid the penalty or interest. Taxes to be paid to County Treasurer. The secretary was instructed to consult attorney, Hoke, and if he so advised, send a written authorization to the County Treasurer to collect taxes in this manner.

A bond, written by attorney Hoke, in the matter of taking land near Moss Spring from Mrs. Frances Winger Davison, was ordered returned to Mr. Hoke for correction.

On request of the Water Manager, a refund of \$ 9.26 was ordered paid Mr. Calvin Strock.

Bills totaling \$ 1897.24, on motion were ordered paid.

On motion, Dr. Gilland, seconded by Dr. Seibert, the Burgess and President was authorized to consult Mr. Charles H. Clippinger in the matter of suits in the licensing of canvassers and peddlers; to learn the proper way of posting bond, etc.

On motion, Dr. Seibert, seconded by Dr. Gilland, the secretary was instructed to see that the Compensation insurance cover the policeman while on duty.

On motion Mr. Davison, seconded by Dr. Gilland, the Burgess was authorized to purchase a car for the use of the police department at a cost of not more than \$ 600.00

On motion, Dr. Gilland, Seconded by Dr. Seibert, the secretary was instructed to take out public liability insurance on the above mentioned car when put in service.
