Regular Meeting, October 7, 1935, Council Hall, 7:30 P. M.

The regular October meeting of Council was held on the above date.

Present: President, Walck, and Councilmen, Stover, Davison, Seibert, and Friedly. Also Burgess Shinham.

Minutes of the last regular meeting and two special meetings were read by the secretary, and approved without change.

Treasurer, Bert, reported as follows:-

Police Chief, O. C. Ambrose made his report of arrests for September. Report showed 21 arrests and the assessment of \$ 122.00 in fines.

On motion, the above reports were accepted and approved.

Bills totaling \$ 579.59 were presented and drafts ordered made out. (See ledger for details.)

The secretary reported that the contract between the Borough and the P. R. R. for removal of the track on Carlisle Street, had been approved by both parties and had been forwarded to the Public Service Commission for approval by that body. Also that the court had approved the bond in the matter of the Lewis H. Bitner Heirs' land.

Burgess Shinham spoke on the desirability of putting on a night officer. Some discussion ensued, but no action was taken.

Water manager Bert, reported a refund of \$ 6.18 to Dr. C. M. Strickler resulting from a vacancy in one of his properties. Mr. Bert also reported that pumping operations had been started at Moss Spring and that a temporary permit to use this water had been obtained from the State Department of Health. The permit to expire Dec. 31, 1935.

The department in charge of the sidewalk project reported that applications had been made for approximately 4953 sq. ft. of concrete paving; 613 linear feet of concrete curbing; and 780 sq. ft. of macadam paving.

(Meeting of Oct. 7, 1935 continued.)

The Street committee reported that the owners of the L. R. Kemp property at the south east corner of Washington Street and Leitersburg street had agreed to allow the corner of the sidewalk to be rounded off to permit free access to Leitersburg Street, provided the Borough would do the work and build about 33 feet of curbing. On motion Dr. Seibert, seconded by Mr. Friedly, this proposition was accepted and the amount of curbing to be included in the sidewalk project.

The water committee reported the gasoline pump engine at Moss Spring badly worn, and suggested replacement by an electric motor. No action was taken, but the president indicated a special meeting would be called to discuss the matter.
