

Special Meeting, October 12, 1935,

A special meeting of Council, called by the President, was held on the above date with all members of Council present.

The matter of installing an electric pump at Moss Spring was discussed. The water committee stated that they had been advised that a 25 h.p. motor would be the proper size. Rates submitted by the Greencastle L. H. F. & P. Co. were also submitted.

On motion, Dr. T. H. Gilland, seconded by Mr. Hoachlander, it was decided to purchase and install an electric motor to replace the present gasoline engine.

On motion Mr. Hoachlander, seconded by Dr. Gilland, the water department was instructed to secure bids for the necessary equipment and to purchase to the best advantage.

On motion Mr. Stover, seconded by Mr. Hoachlander, a right of way was granted to the Greencastle L. H. F. & P. Co. for the consideration of one dollar, allowing the said company to set and maintain all necessary poles and wires, and transformers on borough property for the purpose of furnishing electric service to the Moss Spring pumping station. This right to terminate should the pumping station be abandoned, or electric power be replaced by some other source of power.
